

#### SUMMER SOCIALS

In our continued effort to create opportunities for such participation, we have made available a number of tickets for social events such as baseball games to our members. These have proved to be popular and we may repeat this process next year.

#### AFFORDABLE HOUSING

In collaboration with the St Clare's Multifaith Housing Society, CAPE members will have the opportunity to secure subsidized housing in a brand new development at 180 Sudbury Street. The housing will become available in April 2011. The housing is located in the heart of Toronto's cultural hub (Queen and Dufferin Area), street car at doorstep, 15 minutes to Queen Subway station. CAPE members will be able to secure 1-2 and 3 bedroom apartments at rents that are equal to CMHC and well below the average market rents. The only requirement is proof that the income (in Canada or in the country of immigration) of the CAPE tenants in the previous year was less than four times the unit rent. If your household income for the last tax year was above the amounts shown below you not eligible for a unit.

## Leveraging Global Engineering Skills

CAPE will be finalizing the Leveraging Global Engineering Skills project to pilot an employer-driven, job function-based training curriculum for IEBs using specialized skills and competency matching tools in October 2010. As mentioned in the last newsletter CAPE has now developed a seamless process to help immigrants with engineering backgrounds.

- Become a part of a vibrant welcoming community in Canada
- Access settlement support (employment, skills upgrading, social and community events, discounted insurances, affordable housing, Specialized mortgage information etc)
- Access real-time labour market information about engineering in Canada
- Make informed decisions about your career paths to join the Canadian engineering workforce
- Translate their engineering experiential and academic backgrounds into portfolios with built-in Canadian terminology
- Access employer information, and employment supports comprising of orientation and communication online workshops, tutorials, and curricula driven by the identification of actual skill gaps in real-time

#### **BEYOND EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT**
